What is my National Insurance number and why is it important?

Your National Insurance number is your own personal reference number. It is unique to you and will stay the same all your life.

Please keep this letter in a safe place. Do not share your National Insurance number with anyone who does not need it as knowledge of your number might help someone to steal your identity. **This letter on its own cannot be used to prove your identity.**

What is National Insurance?

You pay National Insurance contributions as well as tax on your income. The amount you pay depends on how much income you get. Your National Insurance contributions count towards basic State Pension and other social security benefits. For further information go to www.hmrc.gov.uk/ni

How do I use my National Insurance number?

You will need your National Insurance number at certain times throughout your life, for example if you apply for a student loan, start working or claim state benefits.

You must give your National Insurance number to every employer you work for straightaway. Make sure you give the right number every time so you pay the correct amount of tax and National Insurance contributions. Always check that your own number is on your payslips.
