Toolbox Talk No. 11 GENERAL SITE HEALTH AND SAFETY

YOUR HEALTH AND SAFETY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Comply with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 or you could be liable for the same penalties
 as your employer. The Act sets out 'employee responsibilities' very clearly and these are also
 reflected in the Raphael Contracting Health and Safety Policy and Procedures
- You have a duty to look after yourself and others affected by what you do and don't do
- Always report any fault or defect which could endanger your health and safety
- You must comply with all safety requirements laid down by your employer
- Don't abuse or damage any PPE supplied for your safety
- Never carry out work of a dangerous nature or operate machines unless you're trained to do so

ON-SITE SAFETY

- Don't drink and drive it could cost you your job
- Don't use drugs, even outside of work time, you could be putting yourself and your workmates at risk
- Don't leave rubbish lying about, clean up as you go
- Don't obstruct gangways or stairs with tools or materials
- Gather up all off-cuts of brick, plasterboard, timber, reinforcing bars, and any other material
- · Route all cables and hoses out of the way. Where possible, suspend them above head height
- An accumulation of waste material provides a good starting point for fire. Don't let it happen
- If tools get damaged, get them repaired or replaced
- When working at height, secure loose objects so they can't fall and injure someone
- Remove nails from timber to prevent foot injuries
- · Store flammable substances, fuel, propane, foam and plastics in a safe place, not next to a fire exit

- Q: What do the site rules cover?

REMEMBER:

If you ignore it, you condone it!

Don't leave it for someone else, it might be too late!!

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Toolbox Talk No. 80 MATERIAL HANDLING AND HOUSEKEEPING

WHAT?

- Poor storage and handling of materials creates waste.
- Waste is a loss of resource and is very costly.
- Poorly stored materials increase the risk of pollution incidents.

WHY?

- Reduce costs: Wastage costs money: not only the cost of the cost of replacement materials but also the disposal cost of those that are damaged.
- Reduce pollution risk: Good storage reduces the risk of spillages.
- Avoid waste: Re-use of materials reduces the requirement for new materials.
- Improved safety: A tidy site is a safe site.
- Public image: Good housekeeping creates a positive image to the general public.

DO

- Avoid double handling as much as possible: less effort, less damage, less wastage
- Supervise the delivery of materials to ensure correct location and method of storage
- Check that a material is fully used prior to starting a new batch
- Return to storage any materials that have not been used
- ✓ Use off-cuts where possible
- Re-use formwork as often as practically possible
- Designate an area for surplus concrete it can be crushed and re-used
- ✓ Pick up litter

DON'T

- x DON'T store or leave unprotected any materials that can be damaged by weather, eg. cement bags
- DON'T over order materials
- DON'T put materials in a skip if they still have a use
- DON'T use new lengths of pipe or cable for short pieces of work. Minimise the need for off-cuts
- DON'T store together any materials that can contaminate each other.

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Toolbox Talk No. 71 ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES FOR CARPENTERS

- Construction timber comes in a large variety of forms, with very differing environmental impacts. Natural timber
 is very sustainable (it can easily be re-used and recycled) but, often not very durable (so we treat it with
 preservatives) or stable (we bond it with formaldehyde and isocyanate glues to make sheet and laminate
 materials).
- Chemicals and glues add dramatically to the environmental impact of such products. While they do not prevent re-use, they can make recycling more difficult as the wood is not 'clean'.
- Knowing where your timber comes from helps you to understand its environmental impact. Transport is a major cost and user of resources, so where you source your timber from is an important consideration.
- The Forestry Stewardship Council (FSC) scheme certifies that timber (both softwood and hardwood) comes from sustainable forests and not from the depletion of tropical rainforests.

Things you can do

We are aiming for the best practical environmental option – a balance between getting the job done well and considering the environmental impact.

You should:

- Know about the types and sources of timber.
- Know about hazardous waste and if your site is a registered producer.
- Use your materials and keep off-cuts for re-use.
- Use mechanical fixings where possible and use fewer composite boards, where we can.
- · Segregate your waste, where the facilities exist.
- Pack skips well a skip is up to 70% air.
- Aim to recycle and reduce packaging waste at the end of a job, up to 35% of waste is packaging.
- Make sure pallets are sent back to the manufacturer, or back to the RCL yard.
- Use FSC timber, we are aiming to use 95% FSC timber in 2010
- Be aware that insulation reduces the energy needed to warm and cool buildings, and so has a direct impact
 on global warming. Insulation delivered to site should never be thrown away.
- WEEE Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Regulations affect all forms of electrical equipment, from
 mobile phones to battery power tools. WEEE is classified as hazardous waste and needs to be deconstructed
 before disposal and therefore cannot be put into a mixed waste skip (or bin at home).
- Batteries Directive on the use and disposal of batteries. Batteries are also now classified as hazardous waste (because of the heavy metal content) and therefore cannot be put into a mixed waste skip.
