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Toolbox Talk No. 46 WEIL'S DISEASE

WEIL'S DISEASE – WHAT IS IT?

- Weil's disease, which is also known as Leptospirosis, is a kind of jaundice
- The disease enters the body through breaks in the skin, and through the lining of the mouth and nose
- It is caused by contact with water contaminated by the urine of rats and other small mammals such as mice and voles. Anywhere that you can find rats is a risk, cellars, accumulated rubbish, standing water, or near a river or stream.
- It starts as a mild illness which can be easily cured if treated early enough
- If left untreated, it becomes more serious and can be fatal
- The problem is that the initial symptoms are very similar to flu and it is possible that you could ignore the symptoms or be treated for the wrong illness

WHAT CAN YOU DO ABOUT IT?

- Don't encourage the presence of vermin, carefully dispose of food waste and tea bags especially on sites that are wet or adjacent to rivers and lakes etc.
- Do not handle the carcasses of dead rats or other small mammals
- If you are at risk, cover all cuts and abrasions with a waterproof dressing and wear appropriate protective clothing
- If you frequently work near water, carry a card or tag saying that you may be at risk of catching the disease
- Be aware that you can catch the disease if you get water in your mouth and nose after falling in
- See your doctor immediately if you think you are infected

WHO IS AT RISK?

- All operatives who may come into contact with contaminated water
- Particularly operatives who work regularly in or near water, such as those engaged in:
 - work on sewers and other drainage systems
 - work on canals and similar conversion projects
 - work in tunnelling

REMEMBER: Good Personal Hygiene is your best Defence!

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Toolbox Talk No.91 FALLING OBJECTS

- A 1lb (450gram) tool dropped just 10 feet would hit you with a mass equivalent to 21 stone (135 kg) in under 1 second!
- In the UK, 'being struck by falling objects' was the highest cause of fatalities in the workplace (21 deaths) in 2011-2012, according to the HSE. It also contributed to 10% or 2,347 non-fatal but major workplace injuries in the same time period.

A dropped tool can cause:

- Severe equipment damage (not just the dropped tool but everything it hits on the way down).
- Costly downtime / project overruns.
- Litigation from death or serious injury of colleagues and co-workers.
- Reputational damage of both contractor and client.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO:

- You need to minimise the risk of being injured by a falling object
 - You need to minimise the risk of tools dropping from height
 - You need to minimise the likelihood of something dropping off the scaffolding edge
- 1. Good housekeeping and neat and tidy working are paramount to avoiding falling objects.**
 - Clean up your own work areas as you do the job.
 - 2. Storage areas are designated for materials and tools – please use them**
 - 3. It is mandatory for all operatives on site to wear hard hats**
 - 4. Where practicable and a requirement, all tools will be tethered and / or stored in tool belt or bucket.**
 - 5. Only take a minimal amount of tools and materials (only what you need) onto a scaffold / tower platform.**
 - Fewer tools and materials on the scaffold platform means less likelihood of something falling
 - More space for working means that objects are less likely to be accidentally kicked or nudged off
 - 6. All fixed scaffolds are fitted with toe boards to prevent falling objects**
 - 7. No large tools e.g. skillsaws / chapsaws are to be taken onto scaffolding – any cutting must be done in designated work / storage areas at ground level**
 - Heavy tools falling could cause a serious injury to someone below
 - 8. Place materials and tools well back from the edges of platforms**
 - All working platforms are close-boarded – check for gaps at the start of the day and move the boards closer, if required - Ensure that smaller items cannot fall through gaps e.g. screws
